- Vines planted in 2011 in San Pasqual Valley, in northeastern San Diego
- · Vineyard soils: Visalia sandy loam
- Pick date: October 4, 2018
- Brix at harvest: 21°
- · Hand-picked at sunrise
- Destemmed for native primary fermentation (14 days)
- Pressed to neutral French oak barrels after primary fermentation
- 6.5 months in barrel before bottling
- SO2: 15 ppm before bottling
- Unfined, unfiltered, not cold-stabilized
- · Bottled April 24, 2019
- The Name: Coucou is a casual way to say "hello" or "hey there!" to friends in French. This Counoise is a fun and juicy light red wine meant to chill down and drink young. (Coucou, glou-glou!)
